Walter Daley

First Lieutenant Walter Ralph Daley died from multiple fragmentation wounds 1 February 1967 while serving with A Co, 2nd Bn, 12th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division, RVN. For action on this date he was awarded the Silver Star. He had been in country 198 Days..



Eugene Conner

Majpor Eugene Joseph Conner FA 44-53 died from artillery, rocket, or mortar fire 31 January 1968 while serving with ADV Team 100, HQ, MACV Advisors, RVN. For actions on this date he was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. He had been in country 60 Days.



Wesley Moore

First Lieutenant Wesley Rice Moore died from friendly fire 1 February 1968 while serving with 1st PLT, A Co, 1st Bn, 8th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division, RVN. He had been in country 60 Days.



Davis Boardman

Second Lieutenant Davis James Boardman died from multiple fragmentation wounds 1 February 1968 while serving with HHC, 3rd Bn, 39th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 25 Days.



Thomas Nichols

Captain Thomas Edward Nichols died from a non hostile helicopter crash 1 February 1968 while serving with ADV Team 95, HQ, MACV Advisors, RVN. For actions on this date he was awarded the Silver Cross. He had been in country 492 Days.



Harry Mosher

Second Lieutenant Harry Van Arnam Mosher died from gun or small arms fire 1 February 1968 while serving with C Co, 2nd Bn, 39th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 74 Days.



John Sevick

Second Lieutenant John Francis Sevick died from artillery, rocket or mortar fire 1 February 1968 while serving with A Co, 3rd Bn, 39th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 78 Days.



Kenneth Albritton

First Lieutenant Kenneth Hosea Albritton died from gun or small arms fire 1 February 1968 while serving with A Co, 1st Bn, 28th Infantry, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. For actions on this date he was posthumously awarded the Silver Star. He had been in country 191 Days.



Melville Rose

First Lieutenant Melville Brice Rose died from gun or small arms fire 1 February 1969 while serving with D Co, 3rd Bn, 60th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 78 Days.

First Lieutenant Lynn Hudson Smith was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for actions on 1 February 1967 while serving with A Co, 3rd Bn, 47th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He was inducted into the OCS Hall of Fame in 2024

Was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for actions on 1 February 1967 while serving with B Btry, 2nd Bn, 33rd Artillery, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. He is also the recipient of the Soldier's medal, and three Bronze Star Medals with V device He was inducted into the OCS Hall of Fame in 2024

First Lieutenant James Edward Taylor was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for actions on 1 February 1967 while serving with B Btry, 2nd Bn, 33rd Artillery, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. He is also the recipient of the Soldier's medal, and three Bronze Star Medals with V device He was inducted into the OCS Hall of Fame in 2024
