Jack Knight

First Lieutenant Jack Llewellyn Knight died from gun or small arms fire 2 February 1945 while serving as Commanding Officer, Troop F, 124th Cavalry Regiment, Mars Task Force, Burma. For action on this date he was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor.



Sam Galloway

Second Lieutenant Sam Harris Galloway IN 49-67 died from gun or small arms fire 31 January 1968 while serving with 1st Plt, A Co, 2nd Bn, 506th Infantry, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. For action on this date he was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. He had been in country 60 Days.



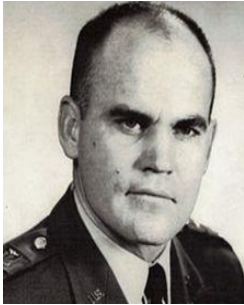
Russell Flesher

Second Lieutenant Russell Ray Flesher died from gun or small arms fire 2 February 1968 while serving with A Co, 1st Bn, 12th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division, RVN. He had been in country 76 Days.



William Lozier

Second Lieutenant William Earl Lozier died from multiple fragmentation wounds 2 February 1968 while serving with A Co, 2nd Bn, 16th Infantry, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 149 Days.



James Payne

Major James Carl Payne died from gun or small arms fire 1 February 1969 while serving with D Co, 3rd Bn, 60th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 78 Days.



Donald Small

First Lieutenant Donald Bruce Small died from artillery, rocket or mortar fire 2 February 1968 while serving with A Co, 3rd Bn, 39th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 26 Days.



Richard Cullen

First Lieutenant Richard Lee Cullen died from multiple fragmentation wounds 2 February 1968 while serving with A Co, 2nd Bn, 27th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 141 Days.



John Culp

First Lieutenant John Paul Culp died from multiple fragmentation wounds 2 February 1968 while serving with F Btry, 4th Bn, 42nd Artillery, 4th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 93 Days.



John McHugh

First Lieutenant John J McHugh IN 110-66 died from gun or small arms fire 31 January 1968 while serving Det B-22 (Qui Nhon), 5th Special Forces Group, RVN. Days in country not reported.



Lynn Smith

First Lieutenant Lynn Hudson Smith died from multiple fragmentation wounds 1 February 1968 while serving with, A C0, 3rd Bn, 47th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. For action on this date he was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. He had been in country 166 Days.



James Taylor

First Lieutenant James Edward Taylor died from gun or small arms fire 1 February 1969 while serving with B Btry, 2nd Bn, 33rd Artillery, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. For action on this date he was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. He is also the recipient of the Soldier's medal, and three Bronze Star Medals with V device. He had been in country 207 Days.



Thomas Staples

First Lieutenant Thomas Trammel Staples died from gun or small arms fire 2 February 1969 while serving with C Co, 2nd Bn, 3rd Infantry, 199th Infantry Brigade, RVN. He had been in country 78 Days.



Michael Austin

First Lieutenant Michael Paul Austin died from artillery, rocket or mortar fire 2 February 1971 while serving with B Co, 229th ENG Bn, 937th ENG Group, 18th ENG Bde, USARV ENG Command, RVN. He had been in country 218 Days.
