Second Lieutenant Roland Wooldriedge Ray IN 9-66 died from gun or small arms fire 27 February 1967 while serving with 3rd Plt, C Co, 2nd Bn, 60th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. For action on this date he was posthumously awarded the Silver Star. He had been in country 88 Days.



Charles Stanley

First Lieutenant Charles Hubert Stanley IN 15-67 died from non hostile accidental grenade explosion 27 February 1968 while serving with D Co, 1st Bn, 2nd Infantry, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 166 Days.



Louis McFarland

First Lieutenant Louis Henry McFarland IN 18-67 died from multiple fragmentation wounds 27 February 1968 while serving with 1st Plt, C Co, 4th Bn, 9th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 118 Days.



Larry Petett

Second Lieutenant Larry Wynn Petett IN 34-67 died from gun or small arms fire 27 February 1967 while serving with 3rd Plt, C Co, 2nd Bn, 60th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 119 Days.



Richard Bovio

Captain Richard Steven Bovio IN 51-67 died from hostile fire 27 February 1970 from wounds received on 20 February 1970 while serving as a pilot with with 281st AHC, 10th Avn Bn, 17th Avn Group, 1st Aviation Brigade, RVN. He had been in country 130 Days.



Ronald Babcock

First Lieutenant Roland Lester Babcock IN 27-69 died from hostile fire causing a helicopter crash 27 February 1971 while serving as a pilot with with B Trp, 7th Sqdn, 1st Cavalry, 1st Aviation Brigade, RVN. Days in country not reported.
