James Gardner

First Lieutenant James Alton Gardner died from gun or small arms fire 7 February 1966 while serving with Recon Plt, HHC, 1st Bn, 327th Infantry, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. For actions on this date he was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor. He had been in country 214 Days.



Franklin Bradley

Captain Franklin S Bradley, Jr died from hostile fire causing helicopter crash 9 February 1968 while serving as a pilot with 121st AHC, 13th Avn Bn, 164th Avn Group, 1st Aviation Brigade, RVN. He had been in country 122 Days.



Douglas Wade

Second Lieutenant Douglas Burem Wade FA 22A-67 died from an other explosive device 9 February 1968 while serving with C Btry, 1st Bn, 321st Artillery, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He had been in country 42 Days.



Samuel McDowell

Second Lieutenant Samuel T McDowell died from gun or small arms fire 9 February 1968 while serving with B Co, 1st Bn, 14th Infantry, 4th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 83 Days.



Jerry Novakovich

Second Lieutenant Jerry A Novakovich died from gun or small arms fire 9 February 1968 while serving with C Co, 1st Bn, 35th Infantry, 4th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 91 Days.



Michael Wilson

First Lieutenant Michael Jack Wilson died from gun or small arms fire 9 February 1969 while serving with B Co, 1st Bn, 14th Infantry, 4th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 154 Days.



Stephen Whisenant

Captain Stephen Lee Whisenant IN died from hostile fire causing helicopter crash 9 February 1971 while serving as a pilot with D Co, 101st Avn Bn 101st Avn Group, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He had been in country 74 Days.
