Lewis Bell

Major Lewis Douglas Bell FA 50-54 died from hostile fire 5 March 1966 while serving as a pilot with B Co, 1st Avn Bn, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. For actions on this date he was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. He had been in country 16 Days.



Barry Zavislan

Captain Barry Alan Zavislan IN 2-62 died from artillery, rocket, or mortar fire 6 March 1967 while serving with ADV Team 87, HQ, MACV Advisors, RVN. He had been in country 122 Days.



Leamuel White

Second Lieutenant Leamuel Artis White IN 24-67 died from multiple fragmentation wounds 6 March 1968 while serving with D Co, 3rd Bn, 22nd Infantry, 25th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 85 Days.



Henry Brommann

First Lieutenant Henry Richard Brommann IN 17-66 died from multiple fragmentation wounds 6 March 1968 while serving with B Co, 1st Bn, 20th Infantry, 11th Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, RVN. He was the recipient of the Silver Star. He had been in country 92 Days.



Eddie Kitchen

Second Lieutenant Eddie Kitchen, Jr IN 28-67 died from multiple fragmentation wounds 6 March 1968 while serving with A Co, 2nd Bn, 39th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 56 Days.



William McAllister

First Lieutenant William Dennis McAllister IN 65-67 died from gun or small arms fire 6 March 1969 while serving with B Co, 3rd Bn, 8th Infantry, 4th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 83 Days.




Michael Woodside

Captain Michael Lee Woodside FA 4-67 died from hostile fire causing helicopter crash 6 March 1968 while serving with HHB, 2nd Bn, 320th Artillery, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He was the recipient of the Silver Star and the Soldier's Medal. He had been in country 123 Days.



John McDonnell

Major John Terence McDonnell FA 6-63 died from hostile fire causing aircraft crash 6 March 1968 while serving as a pilot with 3rd Plt, A Btry, 4th Bn, 77th Artillery, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He had been in country 42 Days.



Billy Creech

First Lieutenant Billy Gene Creech IN 46-67 died from hostile fire 6 March 1968 while serving as a pilot with A Btry, 377th Artillery, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He had been in country 123 Days.
