Charles Black

First Lieutenant Charles Duffy Black died 13 April 1967 from multiple fragmentation wounds 9 April 1967 while serving with C Co, 4th Bn, 47th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 98 Days.



Richard Estrada

First Lieutenant Richard Allen Estrada FA 13-67 died from burns 13 April 1968 while serving with B Btry, 2nd Bn 77th Artillery, 25th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 149 Days.



Randolph Harrison

First Lieutenant Randolph Monroe Harrison IN 15-67 died from multiple fragmentation wounds 13 April 1968 while serving with A Co, 3rd Bn, 21st Infantry, 196th Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, RVN. He had been in country 37 Days.



Joseph Melonson

First Lieutenant Joseph Dudley Melonson, Jr died from multiple fragmentation wounds 13 April 1969 while serving with 1st Plt, D Co, 1st Bn, 502nd Infantry, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He had been in country 135 Days.



Irving Chenoweth

Second Lieutenant Irving S Chenoweth III died from gun or small arms fire 13 April 1969 while serving with C BTRY, 1st Bn, 77th Artillery, 1st Cavalry Division, RVN. He had been in country 89 Days.



Alvie Ledford

Captain Alvie J Ledford, Jr died from an air loss 13 April 1969 while serving with D TRP, 2nd Squadron, 17th Cavalry, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He had been in country 267 Days.



Harold Jensen

Captain Harold Norgaard Jensen died from gun or small arms fire 13 April 1969 while serving with D Co, 1st Bn, 52nd Infantry, 198th Infantry Brigade, RVN. He had been in country 133 Days.



George Everett

◆ DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS ◆

First Lieutenant George W Everett was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for actions on 13 April 1945 while serving with Company B, 1st Battalion, 399th Infantry, 1st Brigade, 100th Infantry Division, Germany. He was inducted into the OCS Hall of Fame in 1972.



Laurence McNamara

◆ DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS ◆

Captain Laurence V McNamara was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for actions on 13 April 1971 while serving with 4th Battalion, 41st Regiment, Advisory Team 22, United States Military Assistance Command, RVN. He was inducted into the OCS Hall of Fame in 2024.
