First Lieutenant Peter Evan Day FA 2-66 died from air loss 27 May 1967 while serving with 116th Assault Helicopter Company, 269th Aviation Battalion, 12th Aviation Group, 1st Aviation Brigade, RVN. He had been in country 27 Days.



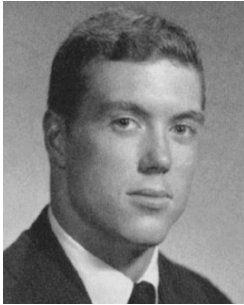
Sylvain White

First Lieutenant Sylvain Larry White FA 5-67 died from multiple fragmentation wounds 27 May 1968 while serving with A Battery, 7th Battalion, 11th Artillery, 25th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 205 Days.

Major William Joseph Ballinger IN 3-57 died from air loss 27 May 1968 while serving with 222nd Personnel Service Company Detachment, 45th Medical Company, 68th Medical Group, 44th Medical Brigade, RVN. He had been in country 390 Days.



Merrill Reich

First Lieutenant Merrill Dale Reich, Jr IN 30-67 died from gun or small arms fire 27 May 1968 while serving with Detachment B-52 (Project Delta), 5th Special Forces Group, RVN. For action on this date he was awarded the Silver Star. He had been in country 12 Days.



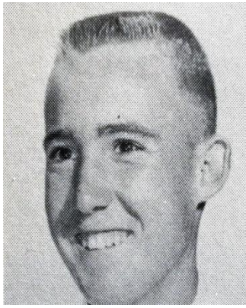
James Clark

First Lieutenant James Woodford Clark IN 47-67 died from an other explosive device 27 May 1969 while serving with Headquarters Company, 2nd Infantry, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 287 Days.



Robert Bensberg

Captain Robert Trame Bensberg IN 29-67 died from artillery, rocket or mortar fire 27 May 1969 while serving with 1st Platoon, A Company, 2nd Battalion, 27th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 42 Days.



William White

Captain William Joseph White, Jr AR 8-67 died from gun or small arms fire 27 May 1970 while serving with Advisory Team 1, HQ, MACV Advisors, RVN. He had been in country 211 Days.



Paul Carter

Captain Paul Dean Carter IN 512-68 died from air loss 27 May 1968 while serving with D Troup, 3rd Squadron, 5th Cavalry, 5th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 223 Days.
