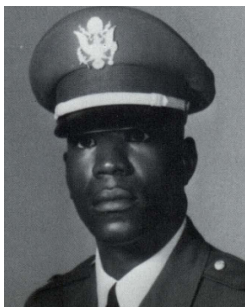

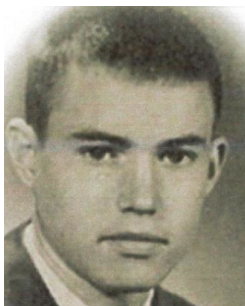
William Crenshaw

Captain William Anderson Crenshaw IN 2-63 died from gun or small arms fire 4 May 1967 while serving with DET A-101 (Land Vei), 5th Special Forces Group, RVN. He had been in country 42 Days.



Franklin Stallings

First Lieutenant Franklin Delano Stallings IN 9-65 died from gun or small arms fire 4 May 1967 while serving with Det A-101 (Lang Vei) 5th Special Forces Group, RVN. He had been in country 272 Days.



Robert Price

Second Lieutenant Robert Glen Price IN 43-67 died from multiple fragmentation wounds 4 May 1968 while serving with D Co, 1st Bn, 18th Infantry, 1st Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 45 Days.



Douglas Fournet

First Lieutenant Douglas B Fournet IN 18-67 died from an other explosive device 4 May 1968 while serving with D Co, 1st Bn, 503rd Infantry, 173rd Abn Bde, RVN. For action on this dae he was awarded the Medal of Honor. He had been in country 42 Days.



James Flagella

Second Lieutenant James P Flagella IN 46-67 died from a helicopter air loss 4 May 1969 while serving with B Co, 227th ASLT Helo Bn, 11th Aviation Group, 1st Cavalry Division, RVN. He had been in country 116 Days.



William Overton

First Lieutenant William Hilliard Overton AR 32-67 died from vehicle striking a mine 4 May 1969 while serving with F TRP, 17th Cavalry, 196th Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, RVN. He had been in country 170 Days.



Larry Mattingly

First Lieutenant Larry Franklin Mattingly FA 508-68 died from a helicopter air loss 4 May 1970 while serving with A Co, 101st Aviation Bn, 101st Aviation Group, 101st Airborne Division, RVN. He had been in country 311 Days.



Douglas Winfrey

Died from artillery, rocket or mortar fire 1 February 1968 while serving with A Co, 3rd Bn, 39th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 78 Days.

First Lieutenant Douglas B Fournet IN 18-67 was awarded the Medal of Honor for actions on 4 May 1968 while serving with D Co, 1st Bn, 503rd Infantry, 173rd Abn Bde, RVN. He was inducted into the OCS Hall of Fame in 1984.
