Everette Light

Second Lieutenant Everette Earl Light IN 5-65 died from non-hostile accidental homicide 4 June 1966 while serving with 1st Platoon, A Company, 1st Battalion, 35th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division, RVN. He had been in country 31 Days.



Gregory Fuchs

Second Lieutenant Gregory G Fuchs FA 13-67 died from an air loss 4 June 1969 while serving with C Battery, 6th Battalion, 14th Artillery, 52nd Artillery Group, I Field Force, RVN. He had been in country 153 Days.



James Kummings

Captain James Albert Kummings FA 21-67 died from an air loss 4 June 1969 while serving with 221st Aviation Company, 307th Aviation Battalion, 164th Aviation Group, 1st Aviation Brigade, RVN. He had been in country 143 Days.



Franco DiTullio

First Lieutenant Franco Antonio DiTullio FA 46A-67 died from artillery rocket or mortar fire 4 June 1969 while serving with C Battery, 6th Battalion, 14th Artillery, 52nd Artillery Group, I Field Force, RVN. He had been in country 168 Days.



Mark Rivest

Second Lieutenant Mark Henry Rivest IN 14-69 died from gun or small arms fire 4 June 1970 while serving with CCC, MACV-SOG, 5th Special Forces Group, RVN. For action on this date he was awarded the Silver Star. He had been in country 236 Days.

Lieutenant Colonel James Joseph Lindsay IN 52-53 was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for action 31 May - 4 June 1968 while Commander 2nd Battalion, 60th Infantry, 1st Brigade, 9th Infantry Division, RVN. He is also the recipient of four Silver Stars. He was inducted into the OCS Hall of Fame in 1977.
